# System Coordination Framework

# St. Johns, Newfoundland, Canada

**Project Description**: St. John's 5-year plan to end homelessness works to channel the efforts of shelters, emergency services, and government supports into a coordinated Housing First program.

**Distinguishing Features**: This 5-year plan is focused on shaping the systemic response to homelessness and maximizing the efficacy of homeless supports already in place.

# SUMMARY

Rather than moving through a cycle of various homeless response services, the 5-year plan aims to coordinate services, guiding the service users towards a positive end goal. This systemic coordination is driven by a Housing First philosophy; the end goal is to eradicate homelessness rather than continually manage it. In this framework, every organization has a collaborative role in improving the supportive housing process.

Key Support Services	
NAVNET	NAVNET is a coordinated response by the provincial government and reginal health authority to provide support for individuals with complex service needs. This includes social support, housing, and income services.
Assertive Community Treatment Team (ACTT)	ACTT provides intensive case management and support through Eastern Health for those with severe mental illness
Case Management Services – Eastern Health	Eastern Health provides front line mental health services to meet a variety of community needs. Services are delivered by a team of mental health providers, nurses, and social workers as they work to meet the needs of community members with functional disabilities.
Housing First	There are multiple housing first programs in St. Johns that work to provide rapid housing placement with complimentary supports to ensure continued housing stability

# Coordinated Access: Provincial and Local

The city currently uses data from the Homeless Individuals & Families Information System (HIFIS) to allow coordinated access across services. The program connects service providers within a community-wide system. This allows services to coordinate intake, assessment, case management, and referrals

# End Homelessness St. John's

End Homelessness St. John's is a longstanding community advisory board working to ensure safe, affordable housing within the community. The board works to define and coordinate housing services in St. Johns to end homelessness within the city. This system coordination framework was developed in partnership with Turner Strategies.
